

What are the **BEST PRACTICES** for Capacity Building for Cooperatives?



- Involving stakeholders in the planning process, and taking into account their pain points, suggestions, strengths and limitations.
- Methodology Capacity Development Plan that looks into the following:
 - Financial Management
 - Staffing and Agri-trading business Operations
 - Resource access and availability
 - Membership services
 - Technology and digital readiness
- Grameen facilitates the review for coops to identify the gaps and their strategies to address this

What are the **BEST PRACTICES** for Capacity Building for Cooperatives?





Link Cooperatives with BwB Volunteers:

Through Grameen's Bankers without Borders Network, a pair of an international and local expert are assigned to provide technical assistance addressing sustainability issues.

- Streamlining the relationship between Cooperative and Mills allows for building trust:
 - Better pricing, immediate payments, priority lanes
 - Other services: medical services, access to drying facilities
 - Mills endorsement of cooperatives to program



Program Implementation Insights



- Face-to-Face builds trust
- Open and frequent communication to align
- Building strong business partnership fair and speedy transactions



Program Implementation Insights - Traceability

Human Centered Design - involve the users and started the design simple, built bottom up

- Training and Tools
- Digitally manage farmer, farm profiles, and selling activities
- Partner mills verification steps for check and balance process.






Stories from our Partners

"When I checked the Farmerlink Traceability System, I realised that the problem is not volume but the quality of copra. We were not practicing strict inspection of copra from farmers thus we had huge deductions upon delivery to the mill. I sent a skilled staff to train and monitor strict quality control practices. Our moisture content improved from around 17% to 11% after that and we observed decrease in deductions after 6 weeks."
